Commonwealth Games - Gold Coast - 2018

For the last three weeks I was lucky enough to be on the Gold Coast as a volunteer with the Commonwealth Games.

My journey started about 12 months ago when I first saw the application process open. After a trip to the Coast for an interview and the subsequent background checks I eventually got the call-up late last year to say my application had been successful, with my role titled Sport Information Team Member (with the sport of hockey). Out of 45 000 applications I was one of the 15 000 lucky ones given an opportunity of a life time. Many trips to the Coast for training weekends followed and when I picked up my uniform about a month before the games started I realised how close the games were to becoming a 'real' adventure.

I thoroughly enjoyed my time as a volunteer where I met lots of great people, got up close with athletes, and enjoyed the atmosphere that the games bring. In my role I was one of about 30 lucky people who had access to two venues. I was based both at the

Commonwealth Games Athletes Village and the Gold Coast Hockey Centre. My role involved dealing with athletes, coaches and managers, and Nations dignitaries. The shift times were quite long, usually 9 hour shifts with a 20 minute (or so) meal break. Some shifts finishing at midnight!

At the village I was lucky that the office I worked out of was right next door to the athletes dining hall. I was able to watch all the athletes from every country file past for breakfast, lunch and dinner (and sometimes more depending on their dietary requirements for their sport!) Some of my responsibilities involved answering questions regarding athletes training sessions and bus schedules to get to venues for athletes.

At the Gold Coast Hockey Centre one of my roles was to input information live to a website on the internet, so people in other countries could follow their teams' progress without having to physically be at the Games.

I was able to meet the President of Ghana hockey, who I got to talk to for about 15 minutes, shake hands and talk to many athletes including Australian hockey.
